INFORMATION AND ASSESMENT FOR SENIOR SERVICES

This assessment will determine eligibility for many city services including, but not limited to, home delivered meals, medical transportation assistance, senior companion program, legal assistance, senior housing information, caregiving resources, employment services, and life enrichment programs. SENIOR CITIZEN WATER BILL SAVINGS


Senior citizens may be able to save on their water bills. If they qualify, seniors could receive an exemption of the sewer charge on all future water bills. In order to qualify, residents must be at least 65 years old, own the property and occupy it as their principal place of residence, have a separate water meter and not have a balance on an existing water bill.

SENIOR CITIZEN PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAMS

There are a variety of discounts and exemptions available to senior citizens who own homes in Chicago. Some of these include Senior Citizen Assessment Freeze Exemption and the Senior Citizen Tax Deferral.

We deserve a safe community!



For far too long, we have been underserved while crime has steadily crept into our community. Last November, I addressed the Chicago Police Superintendent about the shortage of manpower in our 16th and 17th Districts.

To address the recent uptick in crime in the 45th Ward, I have been working diligently with my fellow northwest side colleagues to address vacancies in our communities' police districts.

When we address personnel shortages, we not only create safer, healthier neighborhoods, we also build a stronger police force. By improving the overall morale of our police department, we can help our officers fight crime more effectively. I will continue to advocate and fight for the needed public safety resources our community deserves.

Revitalizing the 45th Ward





Proposed Development at Former Sears Parcel

This mixed-use development worth over \$200 million will bring significant economic stimulus to the area of Six Corners and the greater 45th Ward. The 421 residential dwellings complimented by over 100,000 SF of commercial space will serve to attract future vitality to the area. This project is 100% privately-funded without cost to taxpayers.

Alderman Gardiner secured some of the following public amenities and components:

- Increased the on-site affordable housing count by over 40% to 16 total units from the original proposal.
- Per the Six Corners Master Plan, Alderman Gardiner worked with the developer to secure the
 installation of specialty ornamental pavers on the three corners north of Irving Park Rd. at
 Six Corners. These pavers will be installed completely at private expense.
- Planters and bollards will be implemented at each of the three corners to serve as important pedestrian safety features.

Proposed Development at 4747 W. Irving Park Rd.

This mixed-use development worth over \$130 million includes 258 senior residential dwellings and over 45,000 SF of grocery-anchored retail. After negotiations with developers, Alderman Gardiner secured numerous enhancements and concessions from the developers compared to the original proposal. This project is 100% privately-funded without cost to taxpayers.

What Changed? Enhancements secured for the community:

- Increased the on-site affordable housing unit count from 0 to 11 units. Alderman Gardiner
 fought to secure the full 10% affordable housing component on-site so senior residents from
 our community have the opportunity to live in a facility at a substantial discount based upon
 their income levels.
- Alderman Gardiner worked with the developers to waive the one-time community fee for
 residents who are veterans of the U.S Armed Forces. The savings to residents who served our
 country is \$4,000 each.



Independent living unit count has been increased from 103 to 114. Alderman Gardiner negotiated with the developers to increase the independent component by 11 units . This significant enhancement will bring more active residents to the community; stimulating local businesses and bringing more sales-tax revenue.

Streets & Alleys...

Every year, each of Chicago's 50 wards are given funds that are used to address specific local infrastructure needs through the Aldermanic Menu Program.

As your Alderman, my priority is to maximize these valuable tax dollars by putting them towards infrastructure needs that have long been overlooked. I have committed to investing nearly \$1,000,000 annually to repair our streets and alleys.



Finances

Alderman Gardiner voted NO to the property tax increase in the 2020 Budget!

Here are some key facts Alderman Gardiner supported:

- Investment of close to \$30 million in new funding in the key areas of affordable housing, mental health, homelessness, and violence prevention.
- Increased the city's minimum wage to \$14/hour in 2020 and \$15/hour in 2021.
- Closed a record \$838 million deficit through structural solutions, savings, efficiencies and new revenues.
